So What? Who Cares?

- Space: Custom and Border Protection (CBP)
- Problem (case studies):
 - Inspecting sea containers at seaports for multiple types of contraband
 - Inspecting trucks at land border crossings for multiple types of contraband
 - Interdicting fentanyl in postal mail
 - Interdicting products made with forced labor
 - Developing algorithms for automatic threat recognition (ATR)
- Solution: Convene workshops
 - Solution seekers to pose needs for enhanced technology
 - Technology providers state existence of solutions
 - Discussion & community building
- Results:
 - Three previous ADEPT workshops for CBP
 - Community is being built
